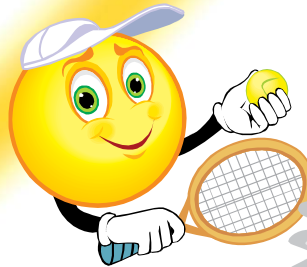


Curriculum Enrichment Week 2014



Dear Parents & Carers

Welcome to the Enrichment Week booklet for 2013-14 **Thursday 17th – Wednesday 23rd July 2014**

Enrichment Week is an important part of the calendar at St. Luke's. We believe whole heartedly that every student should be challenged to try new activities throughout the week whilst also having the opportunity to engage in those pastimes that they are truly passionate about.

Attendance – All students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 must take part in the week and return the necessary forms.

We regard Enrichment Week as an important part of your son or daughter's education, and expect **normal attendance**. Reasons for non-attendance will be required as usual. Every absence must be supported by a parental explanation and holiday forms will not be granted as per the new school guidelines. **In the event of a non-return and a student not opting; they will be expected in College wearing full uniform and will be placed on a normal curriculum for the week. Please also note that all YR10 students MUST be up to date with coursework in order to secure a place on CEW.**

Payment for Activities

All costs are approximate and will usually depend on the final number of students taking part in each activity. If there are insufficient contributions or numbers for a particular activity or for the whole week in general, then that specific activity may have to be cancelled or the whole week suspended and the normal school timetable resumed.

On receipt of this booklet, parents are asked to complete the enclosed forms as noted below and send in the first payment which will act as a **non-refundable deposit**. Once allocations have been made, a confirmation letter will be issued to all students accompanied by a payment card. Please ensure that this payment card is brought in with all subsequent payments so that your contributions can be monitored effectively.

The completed forms and deposits should be posted in the CEW letter box situated near the Key Stage Office by Friday 22nd November 2013. Please also post any subsequent payments in to this letter box. In the interest of security please ensure that cheques are made payable to St. Luke's Science and Sports College and placed in a secure envelope with the student name clearly written on the envelope. Please note to ensure a mix of year groups per activity, it is not always possible to allocate activities on a first come first served basis but instead a number of parameters will be considered.

Attendance and Behaviour

During Enrichment Week, it is essential that students adopt the same standards of behaviour that we expect every day in the College. Throughout the whole week students will be representing St. Luke's in a variety of settings and it is our collective responsibility to ensure that they are respectful of the venues that they use and the individuals who are delivering the sessions. Any students not adhering to the usual standards of behaviour will be removed from the activities and the usual College sanctions will be implemented. At all times parents/carers will be made aware of any such incidents.

Health and Safety

All external centres and organisations are fully checked for their suitability prior to the week. In addition any external deliverers will be subject to the usual safeguarding checks and will be required to submit copies of relevant qualifications. At all times activities will be supported by staff from St. Luke's to the appropriate staffing ratios. All activities will be assessed in terms of risk and appropriate measures put in place.

This activity will lead (if the student is successful) to the award of the PADI Open Water Diver certificate. This will allow the student to dive all over the world in the company of a qualified dive leader and, once they are over 16, with a dive buddy.

It is possible to qualify at a lower level and then complete the full award over the summer.

Students will need to commit to 5 two hour sessions after school to cover the bulk of the theory so that the activity week is spent in the training pool and then the open sea. The dive centre also runs special dives over the summer period for all those who complete the course.

We are hoping to visit the following venues.

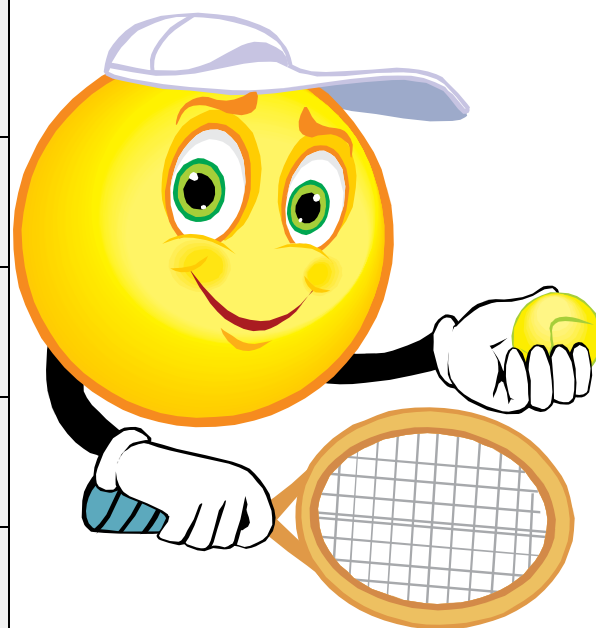

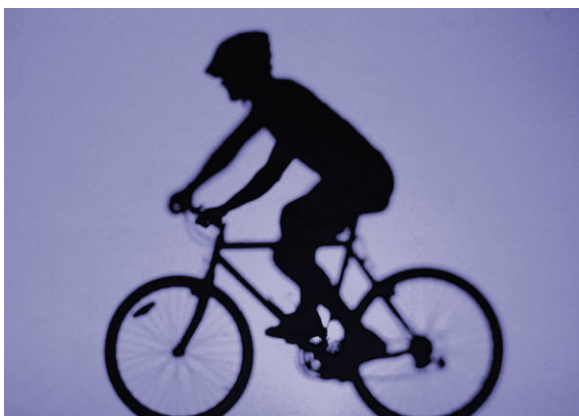

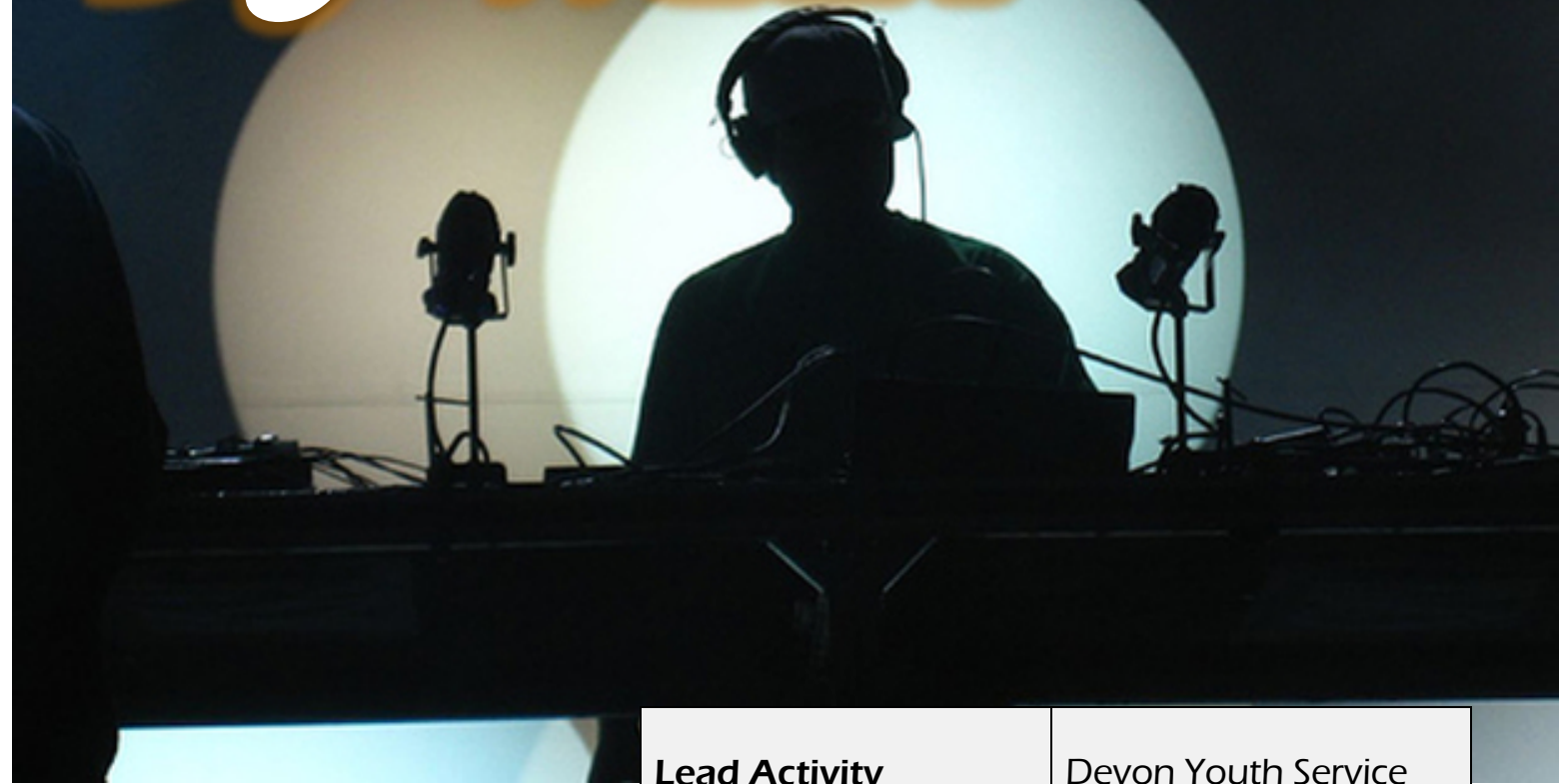

Snowdonia



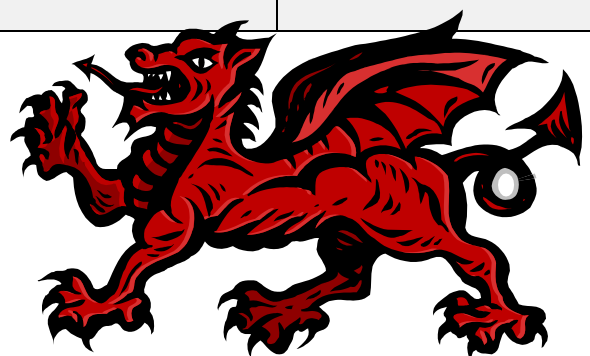
Leaving on Friday 18th, students will experience some spectacular Mountain Walking including a trip up Snowdon.
