We are delighted to celebrate a number of fantastic performances for our Academy athletes.

Football Academy player Ethan Ampadu gained his first national honours when he represented Wales against France in the U16 age group.

Year 9 St Luke's student and Exeter City FC player Ethan Ampadu has won the Victory Shield with the Wales U16 National football squad. Ethan was selected to represent Wales in the under 16 age group, despite this being 2 age categories above his own (U14), a highly impressive achievement.





After a 1-0 win against England at Bangor and a 2-1 victory against Scotland in Perth, a draw was all the young Dragons needed to win the title outright for the first time since the 1948-49 season but they did it in style with a third successive win. This prompted a congratulatory tweet on Twitter from Real Madrid and Wales star Gareth Bale, hailing the boys' success!

Everyone at St Luke's Science & Sports College are incredibly proud of everything Ethan has achieved and continues to achieve in his footballing career. Additionally and perhaps even more admirably, Ethan's feet remain firmly on the ground and he rarely speaks of his achievements, instead choosing to humbly and quietly focus on his studies and enjoy school life with his loyal group of friends.

The Victory Shield is a prestigious International football competition between the British home nations at U16 level. Ethan helped Wales become outright winners of the Victory Shield for the first time in 66 years after a 2-0 win against Northern Ireland in Ballymena.
