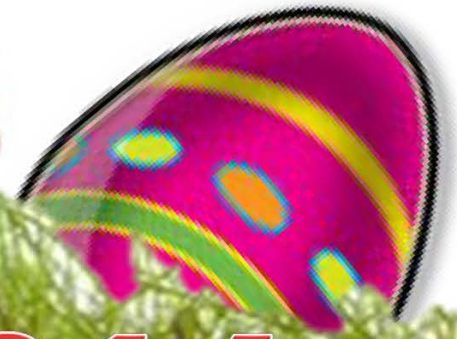

St Luke's competed in its very first gymnastics competition at Exeter Gymnastics Club on Sunday 9th February 2014.

Two teams were entered from St Luke's, one in the Under 14 category and the other in the Under 19 age group. The gymnasts competed a 60 second floor routine comprising of leaps, jumps, balances and tumbles. They also completed two vaults and the scores combined to give the overall results.

St Luke's dominated the medals in the individual competition with Sophie Taylor taking bronze, Jemima Kerley claiming silver and Isabella Kerley winning gold. Out of 7 teams in total, St Luke's came through to win gold overall with an overall score of 118.30.

The year 7 Futsal Team emulated the achievements of last year's year 7 side and were crowned Devon County Futsal Champions after winning the Devon County Finals at Paignton Community College's impressive indoor sports hub.

The side were impressive from start to finish with skilful, creative play and a hugely competitive spirit. More importantly, the students represented themselves and St Luke's in impeccable fashion, looking smart and professional and playing with fantastic respect for one another, the opposition and the officials.

St Luke's were placed in a group with Holsworthy B and Plymstock, playing each of those sides twice. Despite losing one match which they really should have won, but for spurned opportunities, St Luke's qualified for the knockout stages. The group results were as follows:

The side safely booked their passage into the quarter-finals of the Devon County Cup with a hard-fought and at times, frustrating encounter against Paignton.

St Luke's took an early lead when Morgan Cullen pounced onto his own rebounded shot off the post and fired past the Paignton goalkeeper. 1-0.

Paignton equalized from a free kick 35 yards out. St. Luke's goalkeeper Ellis Burgess misjudged the flight of the ball and his late back-peddling only enabled him to tip the ball onto the crossbar. The rebound was pounced on by a Paignton striker and tucked into the net. 1-1.

The score remained 1-1 for the majority of the match, despite sustained St Luke's second half pressure.

Morgan Cullen added his second of the match and Jack Ronchetti added a third.

However, the boys kept the ball really well, tamed any Exmouth threat well through organised and dogged defending and scored a second through Archie Reay, who smashed a loose ball past a defender and the goalkeeper and into the net. Archie added his second of the game after finishing from an angle after being put through on goal by Morgan Cullen. Morgan Cullen added his own name to the score-sheet soon after with a delightful chip over the advancing Exmouth goalkeeper. Exmouth pulled a consolation goal back from a corner and nearly scored a second, only to be denied by a fine Ellis Burgess diving save from a long-range free kick.

The team now advance into the semi-finals, are one win away from another St. James' Park final and are on course to achieve this season's goal of having their name on the trophy.
