

Pupil Premium Information

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is targeted at students who have received free school meals in the last 6 years, students from a forces family or 'looked after' students, to help them achieve more in their academic and social lives.

Approximately 30% of our pupil-roll benefit from the Pupil Premium with St. Luke's utilising this additional resource holistically to support students to achieve significantly better outcomes. In total, we receive approximately £260,000 as a College to support our Pupil Premium students.

How well do our Pupil Premium (PP) students achieve?

In the 2014 – 2015 academic year;

- 23% of our PP students attained 5A*-C including English and Maths.
- 52% of non-pupil premium students attained 5A*-C including English and Maths.
- 67% of PP students made expected progress in English with 78% of non-eligible PP students making expected progress in English.
- 31% of PP students made expected progress in Maths with 54% of non-eligible PP students making expected progress in Maths.
- A significant percentage of PP students access a wide-range of extra-curricular opportunities with targeted clubs being in place for those that are not accessing.

How do we utilise our Pupil Premium resource;

In the 2014 – 2015 academic year; St. Luke's used the Pupil Premium resource in a variety of ways to support improvements in achievement;

- Provision of 4 Assistant Heads of House to track, monitor and mentor PP students (£6,000)
- Provision of additional teaching staff to support PP students through allocated curriculum support lessons (£35,000)
- Appointment of a 2-day/week specialist English teacher dedicated to supporting English in KS4 pupils who are PP (£20,000)
- Allocation of 3 days/week of time from a specialist Maths and Science teacher to support Maths and Science in KS4 for pupils who are PP (£30,000)
- Addition of two teaching staff in English and Maths to enable smaller class sizes in KS4 (£60,000)
- A dedicated Pupil Premium mentoring evening for all PP KS4 students (£400)
- Provision of HLTA in Maths to support PP students (£21,000)
- Provision of HLTA in English to support PP students (£21,000)
- Personalised Curriculum Provision for KS4 students (£41,000)
- Allocation of 2 additional TA's to support access to curriculum by PP students (£22,000)

- Living for Sport 'Aspire' Programme to support students across KS3 to develop positive behaviour strategies (£5,000)
- Bespoke mentoring and support for CiC (2,000)
- Yr7 Residential to support Literacy, Numeracy and PSHE (£3,000)
- Provision of a dedicated solution-focussed mentor to support PP students to remove their barriers to learning (£4,000)

Total: £270, 400

In the 2015-16 Academic Year, St. Luke's Science and Sports College will be utilising the Pupil Premium funding in the following ways with a clear outcome being to 'narrow the gap' between non-pupil premium and pupil-premium students;

- Provision of 2 Assistant Heads of House to track, monitor and mentor PP students (£4,000)
- Appointment of a 2-day/week specialist English teacher dedicated to supporting English in KS4 pupils who are PP (£18,000)
- Appointment of a PP mentor who will work with targeted PP students, in particular low-achieving boys, to support them to achieve expected progress (£1,500)
- Allocate Senior Middle Team Leader to the role of PP Champion with the relentless focus being on monitoring of academic progress of all PP students, (£6,000)
- Additional staffing in English and Maths to enable smaller class sizes in KS4 (£60,000)
- Development of year group strategy groups who will target under-achievement and in particular focus on PP students (£2,000)
- A dedicated Pupil Premium mentoring evening for all PP KS4 students (£400)
- Provision of HLTA in Maths to support PP students (£15,000)
- Provision of HLTA in English to support PP students (£15,000)
- Allocation of 2 specialist TA's to support access to curriculum by PP students (£35,000)
- Appointment of a specialist counsellor to support students to remove barriers to learning (£17,000)
- Living for Sport 'Aspire' Programme to support students across KS3 to develop positive behaviour strategies (£5,000)
- Yr7 Residential to support transition in to school with a specific focus upon Literacy, Numeracy and PSHE (£3,000)
- Provision of a dedicated solution-focussed mentor to support PP students to remove their barriers to learning (£4,000)
- Provision of an additional programme of study support, revision and careers guidance for KS4 PP students (£1,000)
- Support for PP pupils to access off-site activities, extra-curricular, Curriculum Enrichment Week
- Contribution towards specialist uniform and equipment
